

# Independent Authorisation of Blood Component Transfusion (IABT) Policy

The revised All-Wales Independent Authorisation of Blood Component Transfusion (IABT) Policy has now been issued as a Welsh Health Circular



(WHC/2023/039). This revision of the existing policy, which was formerly referred to as Non-medical Authorisation of Blood Component Transfusion (NABT), continues to define the requirements for IABT practice in Wales.

Making the decision to transfuse blood component(s) (or not) involves having and using the relevant knowledge, skills and experience to appropriately assess the need of the patient, which should be done in accordance with patient blood management principles. The IABT policy is intended to facilitate the development of non-medical healthcare professionals so they can undertake this safely and improve patient care.
